(1) A chef uses 6 cups of broth for a soup. How many pints of broth did the chef use?

(2) Sarah drank 3 pints of water during her hike. How many cups of water did she drink?

(3) A recipe calls for 2 quarts of milk. How many cups of milk are needed?

(4) You have 12 cups of orange juice. How many quarts of orange juice do you have?

(5) A baker needs 3 quarts of water for a large batch of dough. If he uses a 1-cup measuring cup, how many times must he fill it?



(6) John filled a container with 5 cups of water. Mary filled another with 2 pints of water. Who has more water?

(7) A jug holds 6 pints of apple cider. How many quarts of apple cider does it hold?

(8) A cake recipe requires 1 pint of milk and 3 cups of water. How many total cups of liquid are needed?

(9) Emily made 1 quart of lemonade. Her friend poured 3 cups into a glass. How many cups of lemonade are left?

(10) A large punch bowl holds 8 pints. If you use a 1-cup scoop, how many scoops will it take to fill the bowl?
