## Dog vs Wolf: Wild Cousins



Dogs and wolves are like cousins. They **both** belong to the canid family. **Both** animals have fur, four legs, and a tail. They also **both** love to run and play, especially when they are young.

**However**, dogs and wolves live very different lives. Dogs often live with people in homes. Wolves live in the wild, in forests or mountains. Dogs eat food given by people, **while** wolves hunt for their own food, like deer.
