Underline the adjective clause in the sentence.

An **adjective clause** is a group of words starting with **who**, **which**, or **that** which describes a noun.

Rule: **who** = people · **which** = things · **that** = people or things

**Example:** The girl who loves math won the prize. → clause describes: **the girl**
