Choose the correct verb form to match the subject.

**Always singular:** everyone, someone, anyone, no one, each, either, neither

**Always plural:** both, few, many, several

**Singular or plural** (check context): all, most, none, some

**Example:** 'Neither of the answers \_\_\_\_ (is / are) correct.' → 'Neither' = always singular → **is**
